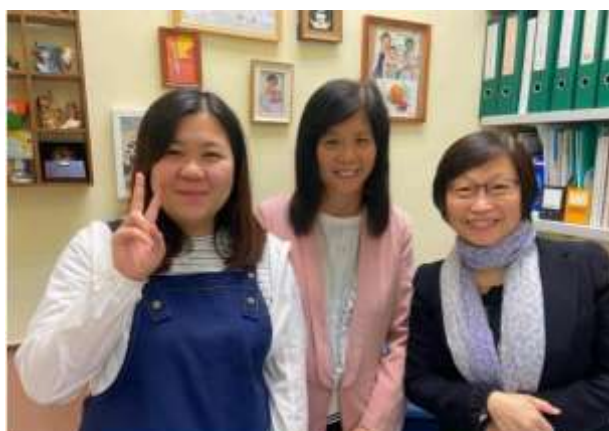

Easily grow bean sprouts at home

Material preparation: steamer and shelf, 2 to 4 sheets of kitchen paper

1. Rinse the mung beans with clean water, then soak them for about 12 hours until the mung bean skins are broken.
2. Put 1 to 2 sheets of kitchen paper on the steamer.
3. Drain off the water, transfer the soaked mung beans to the pot, and arrange them slightly.
4. Cover the mung beans with 1 or 2 sheets of kitchen paper.
5. Put the shelf on the steamer, take it out and rinse it every morning and evening, but don't change the kitchen paper. It can be eaten in about a week in summer, and it will take longer in winter. Except for the rinsing process, remember to store in a dark place away from light.

Materials: orange, jelly powder, honey and water



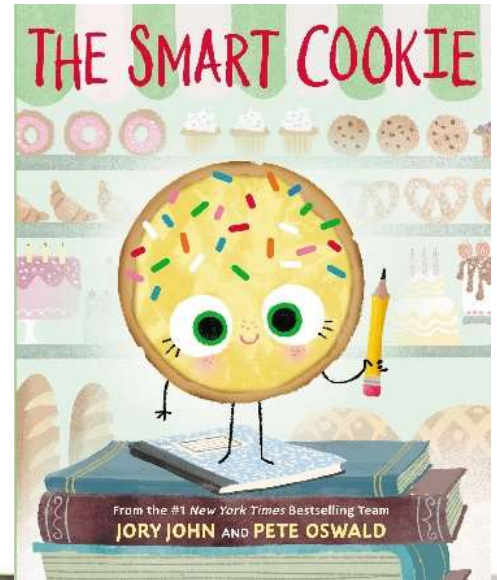

M+ Museum, West Kowloon Cultural District

The M+ Museum officially opened on the 12th of November this year. Online reservations are now available. Admission is free for the first year. It is the largest art and cultural museum in Hong Kong with a total area of 65,000 square meters. There are 6 themed exhibitions: "Hong Kong: Here and Beyond", "M+ Sigg Collection: From Revolution to Globalisation", "Things, Spaces, Interactions", "Individuals, Networks, Expressions", "Antony Gormley: Asian Field", "The Dream of the Museum", there are many exhibits, which are really attractive!



We made an appointment to enter the museum at 2:00 pm. We did not expect a large number of visitors. In addition to the crowd control, the only escalator that goes up and down to the 2nd floor had us waiting in line for 15 minutes 😊. Basically, for every venue, we needed to wait for at least 15 minutes 😊. It's almost like queuing up to play in Disney, but there is no fast pass. Fortunately, Sze Wah who likes to visit art exhibitions, was willing to cooperate 😊.



We strolled around for 4 hours until closing time at 6 pm. The venue was too big and we could only visit 3 pavilions 😊. First of all, we visited "Antony Gormley: Asian Field". Sze Wah thought it was very interesting. Each of the clay dolls is unique. The scene of lining up is very spectacular. It gave her inspiration and she wanted to go home and make one 😊.

The one that resonates most with everyone would be the underground pavilion "Hong Kong: Here and Beyond", which mentions the refugee flows in the 1960s, the tin houses in the 1970s and 1980s, and the popularity of electronic animation in the 1990s. Each exhibit recalls the past. The history of Hong Kong tells about the common memories of the people of Hong Kong, tells the hardships of those years realistically, and witnesses today's Hong Kong becoming an international metropolis.

From the current opening date, Hong Kong residents can visit the exhibitions at the M+ Hall for free. Bookings can be made on the M+ website, the West Kowloon Cultural District website, or the "West Kowloon Cultural District" mobile app 📱

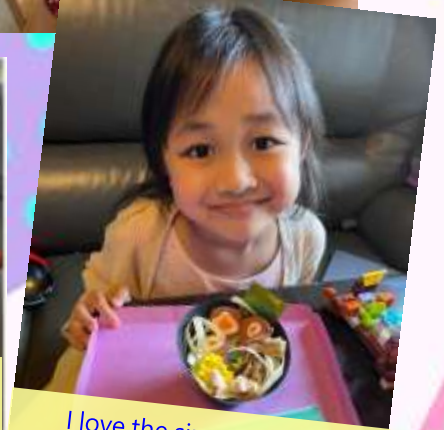
